#### **MMR EARNED**

#### ROBERT SPURGAT

Earns Master Model Railroader® #699

Several months ago, while visiting a hobby shop in Kansas City, I met a young man, age ten, who was perusing the shelves of HO trains. As we got acquainted, he had a lot of questions about scale, track and power supplies, scenery, etc. After a while, I suggested he visit my home railroad (about an hour's drive) to see how to proceed. Five months later, his parents brought him for a visit. He was ecstatic to see and run an operating layout, and an hour later, he left with two freight cars I gave him. One was a gondola made to the NMRA standards of weight, trucks, and wheels, with magnetic couplers that he should use as a reference for all his cars for good operation; the other car was a plastic stock car kit, also made to NMRA standards, but which he had to assemble himself and send me a picture of the completed car. Hopefully, we had a new young model railroader in the making.

This whole experience reminded me of my quest for excellence in trains and life. I received my first Lionel train set as a ten-year-old for Christmas. Soon, I had friends over to run trains, and I was invited to their homes as well. At the age of 12, however, my father (a teacher) took me to the home of a teacher/friend who was building an HO-scale model railroad in his basement. Seeing a diesel switcher running on scale pre-fab track and milledwood roadbed did it. I was hooked on scale model railroading! At the time, we lived in Fort Wayne, Indiana — a block away from the Pennsylvania Railroad main line, with lots of trains pulled by big steam.

Shortly thereafter, our family moved to a suburb of New York City, where I was exposed to lots of passenger traffic via commuter trains and subways. My first "planned" model railroad was a 4x8-foot "plywood central" out of *Model Railroader* magazine. It was mostly completed, scenicked, and running by the time I graduated from high school. Then it was off to college.

At Valparaiso University, a handful of us students built a small model railroad to run trains in our "free" time. Our faculty advisor turned out to be Ken Mortimer, an engineering professor who became active on the NMRA Standards Committee in



the 1960s. His home railroad consisted of a small trolley layout where he tested a lot of his ideas.

For the most part, however, college and medical school didn't allow much time for model railroading. After that, I landed in a Public Health Service Hospital delivering care to the Crow Indian Nation in Montana. Chicago, Burlington & Quincy ran a short daily passenger train near there, which eventually got me to explore that branch through the Wind River Canyon in Wyoming, part of which I have modeled on my home layout: the Wind River Northern Railroad.

After marriage, a family, and a move to Missouri, I was back into railroading. I joined the NMRA in 1973. In 1998, I organized a home layout tour in my local area for the KC National Convention, hosted by the Turkey Creek Division. A small layout in my garage allowed me to experiment with Western and mountain railroading ideas and hone my modeling skills. I also joined a local modular club for which I built two 4-foot modules, now incorporated into my home layout. Getting invited to operating sessions hosted by Joe Ringbauer and the late Floyd Brittian in the KC area convinced me that operations would be my new goal. I joined OP-SIG and attended a few "op-'til-you-drop" weekends. A move to a new home allowed me to rebuild the Wind River Northern into a more operations-oriented scheme. Soon, I was trying car cards and computer-generated switchlists and holding operating sessions.

Upon retirement in 2004, I became more active in the Turkey Creek Division

of the Mid-Continent Region, eventually becoming its Paymaster. I met enthusiastic members like Larry Diehl, Louis Seibel, Larry Alfred, Jack Ferris, Mark Juett, and Dave Jacobs (D). In a conversation with Marty Vaughn, current Regional AP Chairman, he suggested I start working on the Achievement Certificates. So in 2010, he and his wife, along with MMR®s Miles and Fran Hale, spent part of a day scoring my railroad, granting the Golden Spike Award and five certificates. In 2016, I received the certificate for Association Volunteer and in 2022 for Cars. In addition. I have written a few book reviews for the Division newsletter, Lightning Slinger.

It has taken me almost 12 years to obtain my Master Model Railroader® Certificate, and there were times when I wasn't sure if it would happen. Most of it was just motivation. Some good people in the Turkey Creek Division showed me it could be done. My family has been very supportive, and my wife, Susan, has encouraged me all the way. Meeting that young boy at the hobby shop last fall was most gratifying; I was glad that I could "pass it on." I hope that, someday, he will do the same.
